Ribbon-cutting Ceremony Celebrates the Grand Opening of Pennsylvania School Safety Institute

MECHANICSBURG, Pa., May 8, 2023 - The Pennsylvania School Safety Institute (PennSSI) celebrated the grand opening of its 5,000-square-foot, state-of-the-art facility this afternoon with a short program, ribbon-cutting ceremony and guided tours.

PennSSI was established to provide hands-on experiences and classroom training designed to address emerging security threats that may occur in school buildings, on district property or at other locations where students and staff may be present. District personnel, security staff and law enforcement officials learn de-escalation tactics using a multiroom simulator and 360-degree augmented reality.

During the celebration, remarks were provided by:

Each speaker provided commentary on the benefits of the institute, the projected impact and, ultimately, the lives that will be saved.

"Pennsylvania's public schools provide nearly 2 million school-age children with access to an education, extracurricular activities, nutritious food and more. Most importantly, public schools provide students with a safe environment that is conducive to continued learning and personal development. Unfortunately, in recent years, the safety and security of these public buildings have been tested and even targeted," stated Roberta M. Marcus. "Today, we are happy to unveil a new institute designed for key administrators, school safety officers and law enforcement to help them be more prepared to deescalate these situations – the Pennsylvania School Safety Institute (PennSSI)."

Chief Raubenstine shared his first-hand experience, "I've recently experienced PennSSI's immersive scenarios, and I know that the lifelike and interactive nature of the simulations make them an excellent opportunity for our officers to train for what they might encounter as first responders. This technology allows us to practice a range of de-escalation tactics individually or together as a team and receive realtime feedback on how we interact with the simulations. All of these scenarios provide us with a clear advantage in preparing for potential safety and security concerns."
